


## Telemedicine unit opens in Kasaragod

KASARAGOD: As part of a programme to provide free treatment to poor filariasis State and Gulbarga in Karnataka, a telemedicine unit of IAD sources said. the Integrated Applied Dermatology (IAD) was opened here on Tuesday.
